tounded me. The clairvoyant described the
room, with all its special and unique features, as
if she saw it, but saw it with difficulty, through

left an indelible impression on my mind. I was
convinced then, and I am convinced now, that
the power of clairvoyance, as above defined and

power. I felt also, however, that the whole
phenomena bordered on a region into which it is
hardly safe to enter. It is well to feel in so
practical a form the truth of the saying, that there
are more things in heaven and on earth than are
dreamed of in our philosophy.
