These crimes (as *Standard's* correspondent remarks) have been committed by or at the behest of old men who were married to old men, and had to get rid of them in order to be able to attract their attentions to younger favourites. It is reported from Szent Tamas that three of the class of professional poisoners, who are said to have poisoned at least ten at the instigation of the wives of the same, have been arrested. Some sensational crimes may be expected in the course of their trial.

**TAL ASSAULT ON A POLICEMAN.**  
Strabane, Wednesday.

The coroner, held an inquest to-day at Strabane, on the body of Hugh Lin, member of the Liverpool City Police, who was brutally beaten on the 1st of Strabane, and died on Monday last. The coroner explained the injuries. A verdict was returned that deceased died from tetanus, the result of injuries inflicted by John Cooke, David Wilson, and Tom Kidd. **MARKABLE EXPERIENCE OF A SHIP'S CREW.**

**NEWS ON AN UNINHABITED ISLAND.**  
Plymouth, Wednesday.

It has been received of the total loss of the ship *Compadre*, of Liverpool, eight tons, and the detention of the crew for on an uninhabited island. She left Calcutta on January 22nd, and on March 22nd a fire was discovered. Captain Jones bore for Port of New Zealand, but a storm compelled her to beach her on Auckland Island. The crew were ashore from the jibboom, and remained there for days, until taken off by a schooner. They were at the Government depot of provision, and had pigs and goats on the island.

**THE FRUIT TRADE OF JAMAICA.**

*Daily Graphic* says:—The expansion of the fruit trade of Jamaica from £51,000 in 1880, to £1,000,000 in 1890, is perhaps a rare and unusual growth within a decade. But it is a clear indication of the fact, which we too get, that the world's demand for fruit is increasing considerably in advance of the supply which it can get. In Jamaica, of course, there is a ready way suitable for the production of fruit; but it required a beginning to be made in order to obtain the million a year, which is now coming into the market; and so also in our own climate we do not get nearly the amount of fruit which could be raised at a profit without exporting it, not that our climate is unsuitable, but because our people have not yet realised the possibilities of which lie for them in well-directed fruit
