

The majority which supported the second reading of Mr Bowen Rowland's Liquor Traffic Local Veto Bill for Wales included 22 Welsh Liberals, 16 Liberal Unionists, including Sir Edward Watkin and Cornwallis West; 6 Conservatives, including the Hon Arthur Welsh, and 7 anti-Parnellitea. No Welsh members voted in the minority.

FOREIGN

Rome, Thursday.

The funeral obsequies of Prince Napoleon commenced to-day, when the remains were conveyed to the Church of Santa Maria Del Popolo, where Absolutism was pronounced. The body was afterwards taken by train to Qurina for interment in the Church of La Turperga.

New York, Thursday.

The cordage works at Elizabeth, New Jersey were last night destroyed by fire. Two hundred and fifty girls employed in the works rushed panic-stricken into the streets, and altogether 600 people have been thrown idle.
