**ATLANTIC GREYHOUNDS.**  
 Belfast now holds the blue riband of speed in her ships upon the Atlantic. The Majestic, built in Belfast, left Queenstown at 2 in the afternoon of Thursday, July 30, and reached Sandy Hook at 3.20 on Wednesday morning, August 5. Allowing for time differences, she made the passage in five days eighteen hours and eight minutes, and beats the record. Strange to say, she occupied exactly the same time on each of her two latest trips. The Teutonic, a Clyde-built steamer, the City of Paris, the City of New York, and the Majestic have all run to New York from Queenstown in less than six days, and the Etruria in 25 minutes over six days. The City of Paris was the first Atlantic Liner to do the trip in less than six days; and the average of her runs is less than that time. But she is distinctly behind the two great White Star Liners in their averages. The City of New York held the record for last year. She was an hour and ten minutes in her averages better than the Teutonic. Both the Teutonic and the Majestic made under six day runs across the Atlantic last year, and the latter now holds the record.
