## TRICENTENARY CELEBRATIONS.

Tricentenary celebrations were continued when the honorary degrees awarded by university authorities to a large number of men distinguished in science, literature, and art were conferred in the Examination Hall of Trinity College. The candidates, foreign and invited guests left hardly room in the hall for spectators; but the public interest in the proceedings was manifested by the large numbers who thronged the Courts. The candidates were entered in groups according to the faculties in which they graduated, and with reference to each group, Mr Tyrrell, the acting public lecturer, delivered a Latin speech. After the pro-gramme, Mr Irving, who received the degree of Doctor of Letters, was chaired by the students in the courts. The Lord Lieutenant and the Duchess of Zetland gave a garden party at the Regal Lodge yesterday, which was attended by nearly all the visitors to the Tricentenary. In the evening the University authorities entertained the visitors, the Lord Lieutenant, and a large number of distinguished men at a banquet in the Leinster Hall.

## BRITISH SHIP WRECKED.

The ship Peter Stuart, Captain Hughes, from Liverpool, for Liverpool, with a cargo of deal, was wrecked at Crebomtue Point, Yarmouth, on Monday morning in the fog and went to pieces. The captain, wife and child were drowned. The mate, and eleven of the crew succeeded in reaching the shore, though in a very exhausted condition. Four of the crew perished from exposure on the boat. The second mate is missing. Sixteen out of a total of 27 are missing. The ship was a vessel of 1,740 tons register, built in London.—*Dalziel.*
