Mr Henry Varden, of Rusholme, father of the deceased, aid he last saw him alive on Sundayayaning. aid he last saw him alive on Sunday evening, nd he was then in good spirits. He was implicitly and subject to violent headsche. Last ammer he hurt his head by a fall at Cheadle. A onstable said he was with deceased till he died. le never spoke. A relative stated he was in high pirits, and sang during the evening. The erdict was that deceased shot himself whilst isune.
