the house on the occasion in question.

Sergeant Hourigan in reply to Mr Connolly, said the prisoners' characters were very good.

Mr Connolly having addressed the Jury for the

defence, His Honor summed up.

After considerable deliberation, the jury found a verdict of acquital in regard to Brennan, and disagreed in reference to Flynn, who was allowed out on bail to next passizes.
