Sergeant Hourigan gave evidence that when arrested, Brennan denied the charge.

Mr John Guiry was examined for the defence.. He said that Brennan who was in his employment, did not leave the house upon the night in question after six o'clock, except on one occasion when he went to the dairy with milk, and returned immediately. Owing to the make of the lock, Brennan could not have left the house without being heard.

Bridget Flynn gave corroborative evidence, and Flynn's brother was examined, and gave evidence to show that his brother was not out of the house on the occasion in question.

Sergeant Hourigan in reply to Mr Connolly, said the prisoners' characters were very good.

Mr Connolly having addressed the Jury for the defence, His Honor summed up.

After considerable deliberation, the jury found a verdict of acquittal in regard to Brennan, and disagreed in reference to Flynn, who was allowed out on bail to next assizes.

His Honor was engaged to-day in disposing of unimportant ejections and civil bills.
