**THE DANCING MANIA.**  
 The *National Observer*, writing on the recent development of dancing, says:—The schools of the Christmas pantomimes have disseminated an intimate knowledge of the Ballet, and the children, catching it like an infection, have become inoculated throughout the central districts of the metropolis. The excellence of the step is marvellous, and the very newest from the halls are acquired in a twinkling. Whatever private rehearsals these creatures practise to themselves, when they come to the public performance of the pavement they are adepts up to date. Out of the phenomena of the streets, innumerable and picturesque as even now they be, should come a school of dancing, truly national and elegant. Here, then, is our new spirit; an enthusiasm has run through the metropolis, firing alike Belgravia and Soho. In the west, the ladies' papers tell us, there are genteel classes for instruction in the skirt dances; not to be acquainted with the *pas de something* is to confess oneself without the "movement." To show your stockings is to be considered no more than to have aired your shoulders in a May-fair ball-room; to boggle at the former is Amanda at her most sentimental. With their steps and their twirls, with their graces and their prettiness, they have skill, resolve, and liberty. In the streets, in the *salon*, it is all one; they have broken with Amanda's traditions. *Vive la revolution!*

**PRINCE BISMARCK'S TOUR.**  
 Prince and Princess Bismarck arrived at Kissingen from Munich last evening and met with a most enthusiastic reception. The route to the baths was lined with people who loudly cheered as they drove past. An equally cordial greeting was accorded to the Prince at Würzburg. On the arrival of the train there large numbers of persons crowded round the carriage and many of them brought bouquets of flowers which they offered to the ex-Chancellor.

From first to last in Munich Prince Bismarck's reception was most enthusiastic. On Saturday evening there was organized a great procession, and the Prince was serenaded. The president of the Bavarian singers (the *Standard's* correspondent says) proposed a "Hoch to the immortal Imperial Chancellor, who had translated German songs into deeds, and whose journey resembled a triumphal procession. We shall never," he added, "cease to follow Prince Bismarck." In reply, the Prince remarked that he recognized the power of German songs in war as well as in peace. He regarded it as a gracious Providence that his work had lain in the direction indicated by German songs. During the singing of "Die Wacht am Rhein" a laurel-wreath more than six feet in diameter was brought to the villa by the Artists' Club, besides numerous bouquets and other wreaths, with and without inscriptions.
