 The *Svet* of St Petersburg states that Prince Ferdinand of Bulgaria has informed the Bulgarian Synod of his intention to embrace the orthodox faith, and that the Exarch has sent to St Petersburg a confidential personage with the object of endeavouring to obtain recognition of his Highness as Prince of Bulgaria.

A telegram from Braemar last night says—For thirty-six hours a severe snowstorm has raged over the Upper Deeside from Balmoral to Braemar. The average depth of the snow is about eight inches, and the roads are being blocked by the drifts which in some places are four to six feet deep. The mails were late.

During the past year the members of the medical profession in Ireland has decreased by 44. In London the number increased by 198, in the English provinces by 100, and in Scotland by 111. There were at the close of the year 2,445 medical practitioners in Ireland, 2,850 in Scotland, 14,026 in the English provinces, and 5,293 in London.

For some time past the robbery of collection boxes in the Roman Catholic churches of Cork has been of frequent occurrence, and the police and the church authorities have been unable to detect the perpetrators. Yesterday evening the boxes in the South Parish Church were found broken and their contents removed. Two days ago a similar robbery was committed in the Franciscan Church at five o'clock in the afternoon, an hour when the church was empty. In the case yesterday, the thief had remained in the church all night.
