STATISTICS OF FAILURES, &c.
The number of failures recorded in Ireland for the week ending Jan 16th, was 5, viz—New proceedings published in the Dublin Deeds of arrangement filed at the Registry Office, 4. The respective numbers corresponding week of 1891 were—Bankrupts, deeds of arrangement, 8; total, 11; & decrease in bankruptcies of 6, and a rise in deeds of arrangement, in 1892, to 14. The number of bills of sale published in the same week was 7. There was in the corresponding week of last year a decrease of 5, being a net increase in 1892, to date, of 13. The number of judgments published for the same week, 74, of which 18 were against traders against farmers and non-traders.
