on Tuesday of a wanton outrage committed about a mile and a half from the town the previous night. It appears that a fine pleasure boat, which was anchored on the Blackwater river, not far from Glencairne Abbey, the residence of Surgeon-General Betty and belonging to that gentleman, was broken to pieces on Monday night. It is supposed that recently an ill-feeling has been created in the district against Surgeon-General Beatty on account of his having recently appeared as a principal witness against a man who was prosecuted for poaching for salmon. At the same sessions, a coachman in his employment prosecuted a man for using threatening language towards him; and in this case the defendant was also convicted. It is now thought that the ill-feeling which has sprung up on account of these proceedings has led to the destruction of his pleasure-boat.

FATAL ACCIDENT TO A CLERGYMAN.

A shocking accident occurred at Howth on Monday, by which the Rev Horace Skipton, A.B., curate of St Catherine's Church, Thomas-street, Dublin, lost his life. Mr Skipton was staying with his sister at Abbey terrace, Howth, on his holidays. He was last seen on the crags near the Bailey Lighthouse, and while changing his position he lost his balance, and fell over the edge. His body was found at low tide on Thursday night, wedged in between two rocks. The body bore very few marks of violence, and death had evidently been caused by drowning. Mr Skipton, who was only 25 years of age, was a graduate of Trinity College, and nephew of the Dean of Killala.
