At a special meeting of the Kilrush Town Commissioners and Harbour Board last night, Mr Mahony, Chairman, presiding, there being a large attendance, Rev Dr Malone, V G, addressed the board on the necessity of improving their town and harbour, and conveyed a message from Captain Vandeleur promising his support and that of influential English gentlemen to get Government aid for a harbour of refuge. A public meeting is to be held at which the county members and Captain Vandeleur will be present. A resolution was passed asking to have West Clare remedied under the Congested Districts Board.
