DREADFUL SUICIDE AT ADARE

On Saturday morning a farmer named George Sparling, residing at Cloushire, near Adare, committed suicide in a most deliberate and determined fashion, by shooting himself. It appears that deceased's two sons went out to shoot crows n the haggard when he followed them, and taking the gun ordered them to return to the house. They were only a few yards away when they observed their father place the muzzle of the gun to his head and press the trigger with a stick. The shot blew away portion of his head, and scattered his brains about the place. Head-Constable M Coy visited the place immediately afterwards. Sparling had at times shown undoubted symptoms of insanity, and steps were about being taken to have him removed to an asylum. An inquest was, held on Saturday by Dr Ambrose, Newcastle, and a verdict that deceased shot himself while temporarily insane was returned.
