**THE GAELIC LANGUAGE.**

The magistrates and the police in County Cork appear, the *Globe* points out, likely to have rather a busy time. As the result of the recent prosecution of a farmer for placing his address on his cart in the Gaelic language, Captain Donelan, M P, has informed the defendant that he at once had all his carts decked out in Gaelic characters. His example has been followed by Sir Thomas Esmonde, M P, in County Wexford. These signs will, no doubt, be very interesting to the Irish student of the language of his ancestors, but the man whose education did not include Gaelic, and who is knocked down and run over by a drunken carter, will hardly appreciate this new born zeal. To try to revive a language in which, for example, kill, ten, and midnight are respectively marbhghadh, deichneabhar, and meadhonordhe, seems rather hopeless. But they will stick up the boycotting notices in good old Anglo-Saxon.

The Home Secretary has ordered the release of Walter James Lyons, a young man who was sentenced three ago to seven years' penal servitude for the manslaughter of Sergeant-major Stewart, Royal Artillery, at Plumstead. Lyons one night found the soldier at the house of his mother, and believing he was there for an improper purpose, stabbed him to the heart. Lyons was indicted for murder, but the jury found him guilty of the lesser crime.
