## TRAINS SNOWED IIP

New York, Wednesday. On many of the branch lines in the Eastern and Central division traffic has been suspended in consequence of the terrific weather which has been experienced. On the main Central and on the mountain railways the train service has been discontinued owing to fear of avalanches. In New York Bay broken ice has again become dangerous to navigation, and the ferryboat service is greatly impeded, the slips being full of ice. According to telegrams from various parts of New England States the storm there appears to be even more severe than in the Eastern and Central divisions. The gale has been raging all the afternoon, and the fall of snow has been the heaviest known for years, exceeding even the great blizzard of 1888. A number of trains have been snowed up and have had to be abandoned.
