## SEIZURES YESTERDAY.

Nothwithstanding the watchfulness of the Bodyke tenants, the Sub-Sheriff of Clare managed at an early hour yesterday morning to steal a march on them. The preparations for a sensure were made with the utmost secrecy, as it was well understood that at the slightest suspicion of danger the tenants would have their cattle driven to spots where the law could not reach them. Accordingly the Sheriff, Major Cullinan, and six bailiffs left Ennis at half-past five, accompanied by a force of thirty police constables, under com-mand of District Inspector Dunning. They drove on cars to Tulla, some nine miles distant, where they were joined by forty more constables, under command of District Inspector Feely. It was still dark when they left Tulla, and every man was fully armed. On arriving at Bodyke the District Inspectors posted videttes all along the hill tops for four miles round to prevent the sheriff's party from being surprised and fired at by any of the people.
