#### "BULLET-PROOF" UNIFORMS

The Vienna correspondent of the *Chronicle* sends some further particulars concerning the invention of the "bullet-proof" uniform recently tested at Mannheim. The inventor is a Westphalian tailor named Dowe. His invention consists of a composition with which the uniform is covered. It increases the weight of the tunic by a few pounds. The uniforms were made with the newest description. The effect of the composition is, it is said, that the steel face of a bullet is shattered by coming into contact with it. A wooden effigy of a soldier was used as a target, and was fired at from distances of 400 metres. The bullet did not penetrate the cloth at either distance, although at the longer range it caused a depression of three millimetres in the wood. The composition is very thin and is easily portable for application to things other than uniforms. It appears, however, that the head, arms, and legs must remain unprotected by it. Experts state that a soldier could be killed at a distance of 100 or 200 metres, no doubt, be knocked over, and, perhaps, be unconscious for a time, but would certainly not be killed.

#### MONSTER IRISH PIKE.

Mr R. B. Marston writes to the Editor of *James's Gazette* :—

Sir—I have this morning received from Athlone, Ireland, a pike weighing 37lb 4oz, girth 2ft, said to be caught by a fisherman. I have sent the fish to the Fish and Yachting Exhibition at the Royal Aquarium, previous to having it set up as a fine specimen at St Dunstan's House, E.C., March 23.
