Paris on Monday night a large and dangerous bomb was placed by a man who has disappeared at the door of the rooms occupied by Abbé Garnier, a French priest of Socialist, founder and conductor of the paper *Peuple* cause. The wife of the concierge found the lighting and called her husband, who burnt hands in putting it out, then carried away bomb, plunged it in water, and handed it to the police.

#### AN OCEAN RACE.

The ocean race between the Majestic and the Paris, from New York, has been won by the former, which reached Liverpool yesterday, while the Paris only reached Southampton in the course of the evening. It is stated that the Paris had half an hour's start leaving New York, and the passengers of the Majestic complain that after the White Star liner had overtaken and passed the American the latter, steaming past again, crossed the bows of the Majestic at a distance of two or three hundred yards.

The Marquis of Salisbury had a long consultation with other leaders of the Unionist party in the offices of the Conservative Whip yesterday, and afterwards Mr Goschen consulted the speaker as to a motion which is to be proposed this evening to divide the Budget Bill into two parts. This motion will be proposed by Sir John Lubbock.

With reference to the visit of the Queen to Manchester on Monday to open the Ship Canal, the *Court Circular* of last evening says:—"The Queen was deeply gratified by the very great and enthusiastic display of loyalty with which her Majesty was received during her long drive through Manchester and Salford, the decorations of which she greatly admired."
