A MEDIÆVAL CATASTROPHE.

SINGULAR DISCOVERY.

The Shanghai correspondent of the Standard reports a strange occurrence in the district of Haing Knochow, in the neighbouring province of Anhui, where there are extensive coal workings. A party of miners recently struck an ancient shalt, where history records that a great catastrophe occurred four hundred years ago, the records being preserved amongst the local archives.

The miners, on re-opening this old shaft, came upon upwards of 170 bodies of the former workers, lying where they had been overcome with foul gas four centuries back. The corpses were as if those of yesterday, quite fresh looking, and not decayed in any way. The faces were like those of men who had only just died. On an attempt being made to take them outside for burial, they one and all crumbled away, leaving nothing but a pile of dust and the remnants of the stronger part of their clothing.

The uniners, terrified, fled from the spot, and, though there were valuable deposits of coal in the shaft, nothing would induce the super-titious

men to return to their work.
