DUBLIN CATTLE MARKET—THURSDAY.
(L. Cuffe & Sons' Report.)

Good cattle being scarce, made a shade more
money; other sorts brought late rates. Heavy
aged wethers, suitable to the home trade, ex-
perienced a fair inquiry at a slight advance; sheep
for shipping unchanged in value. Lambs being
now plentiful were much lower. Prime beef,
54s to 56s per cwt; secondary and inferior,
45s to 50s; wether mutton, 7d to 7½d per lb;
ewe, 6d to 6½d; lambs, 20s to 35s each.

At market—Beasts, 1,853; increase, 92; Sheep,
3,431; decrease, 1,253. Veal Calves, 11; decrease,
41. No material alteration in the price of Beef
and Mutton from last week, though demand was
well sustained and a better clearance effected.

CORN—There were 0 barrels of wheat, 37
barrels of oats, and 0 barrels of barley in market.
Wheat from 0d to 0d per stone; white oats (round),
10d to 11d; do (Tartary), 8d to 9d; black oats,
9d to 10d; barley, 0d to 0d.

BUTTER—There were 72 firkins in market
this day. The top price for mild cured butter was
from 00s to 00s; good salt do, from 59s to 61s;
medium, 57s to 59s; inferior, 55s to 57s. All
for 3-0-14. Lumps fetched from 8d to 14d
per lb.
