The improved tone of the February fair, and the brisk demand there, evidently raised expectations of a continued advance at this fair, but it may be said, prices remained about the same after one has allowed for the feeding in the interval. Good forward young stock were again in most request, and there was a good run for bullocks, which were much more sought after than heifers and at increased prices. Three year old bullocks fetched from £12 to £15 10s. and heifers from £11 to £13 5s; two year bullocks went from £7 to £11, and heifers from £7 to £10 5s; yearlings sold from £4 10s to £6; good useful young cows ranged from £9 to £13, and springers paid from £15 to £17 10s. The stripper class showed a fall of from 30s to £2 on last year. On the whole, bullocks fetched £1 more than last year's fair, and heifers about £1 less. First quality beef touched £55 a cwt, and inferior sorts went down to 45s.

The sheep department was fairly well stocked. Wether mutton went from 6½ to 7d, and ewe from 6d to 6½d. Mr Michael Sheahan sold a lot of fat sheep at 53s a piece; Mr Rody Murphy sold a lot at 50s; Mr Patrick Hannan sold a lot at the same figure; Mr L Kelly sold two lots to Mr M Allender, Kiskee, obtaining 51s for one lot, Mr M Considine gave 48s 6d for a score, and 52s 6d for another lot; Mr T Flaherty bought three lots at 50s, 42s, and 48s; Mr J Glynn sold a lot at 33s; Mr J Foley sold a lot to Mr Cuffs at 88s.

There were a large number of pigs in market, all of which were bought up at the current quotations by the local and Limerick buyers.
