D BALFOUR'S SPEECH.

Correspondent of the *Irish Times* has published a speech of a Chief Secretary for Ireland which has produced a more pleasing impression than any other. Gerald Balfour on Thursday evening made the extravagant demands of Mr Dillon and the lugubrious mixture of facts and opinions which he relied upon by Mr Dillon.
