

declamation of politicians voiced by organs like the *Sun*, the *Press*, the *Journal*, the *Tribune*, and other Anglophobist papers may be set the calm and temperate opinions of the *World*, the *Evening Post*, and the *Staatszeitung*. In Boston opinion seems divided, though some local patriotic papers like the *Boston Herald* are forced to admit that if Congress supports Mr Cleveland, war may be the consequence. The *Press* of various other towns is more aggressive. This is notably the case in Philadelphia, San Francisco, and Chicago where the message is unreservedly approved. With a few exceptions the Governors of the States and other political celebrities interviewed commend Mr Cleveland's attitude as dignified and bold. Governor Altgold, of Illinois, however, sounds a discordant note. "When carefully analysed," says he, "this message is found to be a cry to Congress of help the administration. Let go the tiger's tail."
