### THE GOVERNMENT AND EMPLOYERS' LIABILITY.

Sir Matthew White Ridley, Home Secretary, replying to a deputation from the Trades' Union Congress at the Foreign Office yesterday, said it was the intention of the Government to make a serious attempt to deal with the question of Employers' Liability in the ensuing session, and to amend the Act on broad and comprehensive lines. With regard to contracting out, the Government would at least go as far in the protection of the mutual insurance societies as they did in opposition; they could not recede from the position then taken up. As to the Factories Act, he wished for the continuity in the administration of the Home Office in carrying out the Act for the benefit of the working classes.

### MR. ROBERT WORTHINGTON'S ACTION.

The Master of the Rolls on Tuesday gave judgment in the action of Mr Robert Worthington against Mr Robert Gardner, seeking to hold the latter responsible for an alleged fraudulent undervaluation of the plaintiff's property, which enabled the defendant to purchase certain shares at an undervaluation and to realise a considerable sum by re-sale, which plaintiff contended defendant should now refund, alleging that Mr Gardner should be held to have acted not for himself, but as agent for plaintiff. The Master of the Rolls held that Mr Worthington had parted with all his interest in these shares to the National Bank before they were purchased by the defendant, and that therefore the relation of principal and agent did not exist between them. The plaintiff's case failed, not only in substance, but upon the merits. But the whole of this case had been brought on the defendant by his concealing from the plaintiff his purchase of these shares. The action was dismissed, but without costs.

### THE LIBERATOR CASE.

At the resumed trial of the Liberator directors yesterday, Mr O'Connor, opening the defence for Balfour, said he was directed to offer the jury and the public the expression of Balfour's lifelong regret that he committed the act of folly of fleeing the country. Balfour had spent his time and energy in political work, and in trying to restore the companies to a sound state, but failed. Finding himself the object of pitiless attack, he unwisely acted on the advice of men who ought to have known better.

### THE GUINNESS LABEL.

The annual general meeting of the City of Cork Licensed Trade Protective Association, was held yesterday in the Imperial Hotel. Resolutions were passed protesting against the restrictive measures which it was sought to be imposed on the trade, and also advising the rejection of the proposed label of Messrs Guinness & Co, as it was manifestly calculated to create an unfair monopoly.

### A WORK OF NECESSITY.

A bicycle rider was arrested in New York recently under the law forbidding Sunday labour for mending a puncture in his wheel on the first day of the week. The magistrate ruled that the mending of a puncture in a bicycle tyre on Sunday, if the accident occurred on that day, was a work of necessity.
