### DEATH OF MR. EDWARD JOHNSTON GILDEA.

We regret to announce the death recently at his residence, Rudolf Strasse, Leipzig, Germany, of the above gentleman. The deceased will be remembered as late Governor of her Majesty's Prison at Naas, County Kildare, at a time which wa amongst the most remarkable in Irelandthat or the Fenian Rising-and many of the prisoners connected with which Mr Gilden had under his care in this prison. On the occasion of the escape of the notorious Stephens from Harrold's Cross Prison, Mr Gildes was heard to say-"If the authorities had placed him under my charge he would not have so easily escaped." At that time the Governor was only about 26 years of a e-a period of life rather youthful for such an important position. Mr Gilden was third son of the late E Irwin Gilden, Esq. of Weatherford, County Mayo; grandson of the late Captain Jones Gilden, Justice of Corum for Mayo and Sligo; great-grandson of the late Robert Hewitt, J.P., Snugborough, County Clare, and greatgreat-grandson of the late Harry Bridgeman, JP, of Broadford Castle, County Clare, also Killa. doon, Killaderry, and Backfield. The la e Governor of her Majesty's Prison at Naas, County Kildare, was elder brother of the late J Rudo'ph Gildea, Governor of her Majesty's Prison at Kilmainham, and later at her Majesty's Prison. Limerick, where he died in harness on January 10th, 1892.
