### A GREAT STEAMER ORDERED FROM BELFAST.

Belfast, Monday.

The Netherlands American Steam Navigation Company have just placed an order with Messrs Harland and Wolff, Belfast, for a ten thousand tons, dead weight capacity, twin screw steamer for their passenger and freight service to New York. This vessel will be 510 feet long and will accommodate for 850 cabin passengers. We have good reason for believing that a ship has been completed at Messrs Harland and Wolff's works nearly 700 feet long.

The subscriptions for the first instalment, 250 million pesetas, of the Spanish National International Loan of 400 million opened yesterday throughout Spain. Much popular enthusiasm was displayed, and subscriptions were received to the extent of about \$50,000,000.

It is reported that the British naval force in the North Pacific is to be increased, that several cruisers are also expected to arrive shortly at Halifax to be stationed there during the winter, and that defensive works are being constructed at various points on the Canadian Pacific Railway.

Another fire broke out last evening at the Railway Gas Works in Bray, where there was a very serious outbreak last September, resulting in the burning down of the works, which were afterwards temporarily repaired, and continued working till last night's outbreak. A fitter who was repairing pipes when the fire broke out was severely burned and was taken to hospital. The Fire Brigade speedily extinguished the flames.
