ENNIS PETTY SESSIONS.
YESTERDAY.

The cases at the suit of the Ennis Board of
Guardians against Michael Cahir and Myles
Keane, junr, for supplying milk to the Union
Workhouse, which was found on analysis to have
been deprived of a considerable proportion of its
fats, were again called, when

Mr Healy, solicitor for the defendants, raised
a point of improper service, as the necessary
seven days had not elapsed between the service
and the date of hearing.

The Bench held the point good, and gave a
dismiss, Mr Lynch intimating he would take out
fresh summonses.

A number of summonses were listed at the suit
of the Ennis Board of Guardians against a num-
ber of ratepayers, for alleged arrears of rates.
The cases were all from the Doora division.

The defence in most of the cases was that the
rates had been paid to ex-Collector Fahy, who
had since absconded, and gone to America, and in
some cases receipts were produced, while in others
the defendants alleged that they had got no re-
ceipts at all from the collector.

Where the Bench were satisfied with the re-
ceipts produced, the summonses were dismissed,
and in the other cases decrees were pronounced.

Mr Lynch, appeared for the guardians.
Mr Healy, solicitor, appeared for the majority of
the defendants.

The other cases were of no public interest, and
the Court adjourned.
