CLOSE OF THE TRADES UNION CONGRESS.

The Trades Union Congress concluded this morning with the usual votes of thanks. A discussion took place as to the composition of the Parliamentary Committee, a proposition being made to include Mr Gee, of Huddersfield, on the ground that he represented the wool trade which was quite distinct from the cotton trade. On being put to the Congress the President declared the motion negatived, whereupon a show of hands was demanded, but Mr Gee withdrew his name.
