

Two steamers yesterday passed up the Jurash Rapid and it is hoped that they will in the course of to-day reach the Fash Rapid. Some of the steamers which are to attempt the passage are baited all round with hawsers to prevent strain or injury to any part of the vessel.

**MORE FIGHTING.**

A telegram from Balawayo states that Colonel White has relieved Hartley, where he found the people well provisioned.

Turner and Carrick were killed while attempting to reach Fort Salisbury on June 17, Mooney and Thurgood had also been murdered.

Colonel White had four fights with the rebels, of whom he killed 150. He lost Gwilliam killed and Arnot and Kerr wounded.

The Salisbury Lager has been broken up. News from Umtali, under date Jul. 21, shows that Makoni is inciting the chiefs in that district to rise.

There are hopes that the imperial troops will relieve the settlers of further fighting, and consequently the arrival of the additional reinforcements is keenly awaited. Eighty imperial mounted infantry, under Captain Jenner, arrived at Umtali on Sunday, and reported all well. Captain Alderson's force is shortly expected.

A detachment of the 7th Hussars has left Mangoch for the Khami River, while another left on Wednesday.
