THE BARNATO MINES.

Johannesburg, Monday.

The situation as regards the mining and industrial outlook is not re-assuring.

Mr Barnato says he will be obliged to close his mines if the Transvaal executive arrives at no decision respecting the prisoners by Wednesday next. He intends to proceed to Cape Town to sit in the House of Assembly in a few days. The sale of his property has been postponed.

ACCIDENT TO LORD CALTHORPE.

Lord Calthorpe had a leg broken in London this morning. He was riding in the Park when the horse threw him and kicked him in the leg. The animal fell, pinning his leg between its body and the ground, and snapping the bone just above the ankle. The limb has been set, and his lordship is doing well.

SUPPOSED YACHTING CASUALTY.

At Athlone yesterday Mr E Everett, of Athlone Woolen Mills, went for a sail on Lough Ree, accompanied by his son Louis and a lad named Malglish. They did not return, and all hope of their safety has now been relinquished.

DIVORCE CASE.

In the Divorce Court to-day Colonel Stoneman sued for a divorce from his wife, alleging adultery against M. Pally, a Greek, and Lieut.-Colonel Kelly, damages being claimed against the latter. The charges were denied. The petitioner, in evidence, said respondent had admitted to him misconduct with Pally. Adjourned till Thursday.

GENERAL BUILDING STRIKE.

The London carpenters on strike to-day state that sixty-two firms have granted their demands. The official figures of the men idle this morning were—Labourers, 6,500; bricklayers, 2,500; stonemasons, 2,500, and eight and nine thousand painters and joiners, of whom nearly two thousand resumed work to-day on the new contracts.
