His Lordship's in-calf heifers made £16 15s, £15, &c, average £14 10s. Mr Fermoy's 20 in-calf heifers sold well, prices £17, £16 10s, £16, £15 10s, £15 5s, &c, average £14 10s. Mr M O'Brien's heifers made and averaged £14 2s 6d. Mr David Kelly's cows sold at prices like £14, and averaged 16d. Hoggets, 30s.
