

enforced under an "affiliation order," and contended that inasmuch as there is no such thing as an affiliation order in the Petty Sessions Court in Ireland, there is no means of enforcing the order for maintenance in Ireland and that inasmuch as the Act is therefore inoperative there, the order of the magistrates by which the defendant was ordered to pay a sum of £5 8s. and 20c. costs, to be levied by distress and sale of the goods of the defendant was bad on the face of it, and should be quashed. Counsel argued powers which, Poor Law guardians have of proceeding against the husband for allowing his wife to become chargeable to the union by way of civil bill did not apply.

The Court granted the application and directed in view of the novelty of the point which was raised, and its importance, that the order should be made absolute in court, and that notice should be served to that effect on the Chief Crown Solicitor for Ireland and the Clerk of Petty Sessions.

AN ADDITIONAL LAND JUDGE.

Last night's *Dublin Gazette* contains the announcement that the Right Hon Mr Justice Madden has, with his own consent and until further order, been appointed as an additional Land Judge for the purpose of the Record of Title (Ireland) Act, 1865, and the Local Registration of Title (Ireland) Act, 1891. The nomination has been made by the Lord Chancellor by virtue of the powers contained in the Land Act of 1896.
