CONSTABULARY INSPECTION.

PRESENTATION TO AN ACTING-SERGEANT.

Sir Andrew Reid, Inspector-General of the Royal Irish Constabulary, who arrived in town on Saturday, inspected the Limerick district force to-day at William-street Barrack. The men were in command of County Inspector Moriarty, District Inspector Hetreed, and Head Constables Feeney, Morrow, and Fitzgerald. The inspection commenced at nine o'clock, and continued uninterruptedly for about six hours. The men, including the cavalry, were put through the various evolutions of drill, which they performed with marked precision and smartness. At the conclusion of the parade, Sir Andrew Reid presented Acting-Sergeant George Ross, Adams, with a valuable gold watch, a similar presentation having been made for the last three years to the candidate who takes the highest marks at the annual competitive examination for the rank of acting-sergeant. The watch bears the following inscription:—"Presented by Inspector-General Sir Andrew Reid, C.B., to Acting-Sergeant George Ross, R.I. Constabulary, prizeman at the competitive examination for constabulary for promotion, 1895."
