WOMEN'S SUFFRAGE.

Mr Leonard Courtney, M.P., presiding last night at a meeting in favour of the Women's Suffrage Bill, congratulated them upon the fact of the second reading of the Bill. He hoped that the forms of the House of Commons would not haffle the further stages of the Bill. They had fixed the Committee stage for the 7th July, and if the Bill passed that stage he thought it would become law. He did not think the House of Lords would interfere with the discretion of the House of Commons in determining who should elect the House of Commons,

LORD MONK BRETTON.

Lerd Monk Bretton, who died on Tuesday, could look back on a lengthy Parliamentary career. After distinguishing himself both at Eton and Christ Church, he was called to the bar at Lincoln's Inn, but eventually made politics the main business of his life. As Mr Dodson he r presented East Sussex, Chester, and Scartorough in the Liberal interests, and in 1880 became President of the Local Government Board. He also fill d the offices of Financial Secretary to the Treasury, Chancellor of the Duchy of Lancaster, and Deputy Speaker and Chairman. greatest achievement was the passing of the Employers' Liability Act of 1880 while he was at the Local Government Office. Mr Gladstone made him a Peer in 1885.
