Cape Town, Thursday.

Captain Wood, with a patrol of eighty men of the Cape Mounted Rifles and twenty loyal natives, engaged the rebel Bechuana chief Gushwe at Landberg. Owing to the large number of the rebels and the scarcity of water, the Rifles were obliged to retire. Lieut Hopkins and Private Venue were killed. The rebels' loss was heavy.
