### DISTURBANCES IN CRETE.

Constantinople, Wednesday.

News from Crete states that anarchy reigns in the Canes district, where fighting continues between the Christians and Mussulmans. The Porte is taking measures for reinforcing the garrison. Opinion, however, prevails in Turkish circles that the pacification of the island should be undertaken by the Powers, and not Turkey. The Porte has promised the Young Turkey Party abroad a full pardon, and state that employment will be given them if they return and cease agitation. The military court to retry Mazhar Bey has been reformed, and new Judges appointed.
