A YIDDISH NEWSPAPER.

For a fortnight London has been able to boast
a daily newspaper printed entirely in Yiddish, a
jargon understood by poor Jews throughout the
world. This organ is being sent to Manchester,
Leeds, Birmingham, and foreign countries, in-
cluding Russia. The object of the paper is to
abolish sweating, but a secondary purpose is to
insist that the synagogues are for the poor as well
as for the rich Jews. Five thousand copies a day
is already the circulation, the price being one
halfpenny for this novel addition to journalism.

SAD RELIC OF A FATAL WRECK.

The French steamer at Dover was advised
yesterday morning of the recovery off Ostend, by
a Boulogne fishing-boat, of the body of a yachts-
man believed to be that of Dr Ballue, proprietor
of the yacht Priny, which was run down, it is sup-
posed, by any Ostend steamer on July 23, all
hands on board losing their lives. A reward
of £200 was offered for recovery of Dr Ballue's
body.
