THE POWERS AND THE PORTE.

A DECISIVE NOTE.

Constantinople, Friday.

A collective note which the Ambassadors pre-
sented to the Porte in the name of the Powers
yesterday is couched in very severe terms, and
insists upon the frontier line as traced by the
military attache's. As, however, no date is fixed
within which the Porte should effect the pro-
posed settlement, great doubt exists whether
the note shall have the desired effect.
