Mr Harrington does not appear to have made any sign as to his future intentions, but he is known to be opposed to serving under the leadership of Mr Dillon.

REWARDS FOR GALLANTRY IN IRELAND

In the list of awards yesterday announced by the Royal Humane Society for acts of conspicuous gallantry in saving life brought under its notice this month there were several from Ireland which received recognition from the committee. Thomas Geehan, 32, railway porter, and Constable E Welsh, of the same age, both hailing from Maynooth, county Kildare, were unanimously voted handsome testimonials for their combined act of bravery on the evening of the 7th ult. The case was represented by Lord Frederick Fitzgerald, of Carton, Maynooth, who describes the rescue of young Christopher Toole, 6 years of age, as one of great courage and promptitude in action. The boy, it is shown, had climbed upon the battlements of the canal bridge to watch a passing train, and in his temporary excitement lost his balance, and fell over 23 feet into deep water. Geehan, hearing the cries for help, at once ran to the spot, and without removing any part of his clothing, plunged in. The boy by this had disappeared, but the plucky railwayman dived repeatedly, and at last got him from the mud, and swam with him to the bank. Constable Walsh, though no swimmer, appeared on the scene a minute previously, and also plunged in and assisted Geehan to land the boy. The little fellow was apparently beyond human aid, but Walsh, in his wet clothes, thought otherwise, and at once commenced resuscitatory treatment, which, after half an hour's treatment, was successful.

On the same date, and at nearly the same time in the evening, at Ballinskelligs, in Co. Kerry, a child fell from the pier at that place into the sea, which at the time was about 10ft deep, with a heavy swell running. E A Stimpson, a lad of 16, was the rescuer in this case. The child must have been drowned but for Stimpson, who plunged in fully clothed, and at great risk got him to a boat which had put off from the pier. An able-bodied seaman named S J O'Connor, now third officer of the steamer Matabele, also receives the medal for his gallantry in a case of rescue reported by Donald Currie and Co.

ALLEGED INSULT TO THE QUEEN.

Pretertia, Monday. Judgment was delivered to-day in the case of Lieutenant Ekff, who was charged with slandering Queen Victoria. The Court discharged the prisoner on the ground that the evidence was most conflicting.
