#### FUNERAL OF THE LATE MR WILLIAM CRONIN.

The remains of the late Mr William Cronin, who was accidentally drowned at the Limerick Regatta on Friday evening, were removed on Sunday afternoon from St Michael's R. C. Church for interment in the family burial place at Mungrat. The circumstances of the extremely sad fatality have aroused amongst all classes and creeds the deepest sympathy with the relatives of the deceased, who was most intimately connected with commercial interests in Limerick by reason of his position as an official in the employment of Mr Murphy, Carting Agent of the Waterford, Limerick, and Western Railway. He was highly esteemed by a host of friends, as was proved by the immense proportions of the funeral on Sunday last. The coffin was borne on the shoulders of several friends through the city.
