Mr Curzon completely vindicated the refusal
of the British Government to separate itself from
the European Concert. Such a separation could
do nothing for Greece or Crete, and would,
moreover, be in itself a cowardly policy. It
should hardly be necessary to prove that Eng-
land is not propping up the Turkish Empire.
The integrity of Turkey is, as Mr Curzon aptly
put it, the most elastic formula in the world; it
means simply that inevitable dissolution is to be
a gradual and not a violent process, and to be so
ordered as not to bring about the danger of a
general war.—Globe.

Montenegro is officially announced to have no
political significance, being merely a family
affair, I am assured that the visit is connected

It is rumoured that in meeting Queen Victoria,
and in his visit to Rome, the Prince is preparing
