AIRERS AND BOILER-MAKERS' CONFERENCE.

Association telegraphs that the members of London and representatives of makers resumed their conference in London to-day. At the conclusion of the proceedings which were private, Mr Knight, Chairman of the Carlisle meeting, stated that a settlement had been effected on the lines of the 1892 agreement and that the lock-out notices affecting makers would be withdrawn. This was confirmed subsequently by Mr Chairman of the Master Ship Repairers' Association, who officially announced that the negotiations in dispute had been left to be settled upon mutually. By the agreement of the Association was a concession of one-hour's "walk-out" upon repair work only, but the other had no reference to an eight hours' day. Pearson, Deputy Chairman of the Association, remarked to a Press Association representative that the masters had little to say and would abide by the action to-day, by their executive council.

IRISH PILGRIMS IN ROME.

PRESENTED TO THE POPE.

Rome, Thursday. Irish pilgrims this morning attended the Mass in the Vatican. The Pope delivered a sermon from the altar, and later about 100 Irish pilgrims were presented to his holiness and kissed his hands. The Pope, in a friendly manner, dressed to each pilgrim a few gracious words and later in the afternoon the remaining pilgrims were received. In the evening the pilgrims attend a reception at St Peter's.

RETRIBUTION AT DEVONPORT.

Retribution, arising out of the stranding of the "Herald" and Lynx, was resumed at Devonport to-day. The formal finding of the court was as follows:—The court having found that the charge against Commander "Herald" is partly proven, and taking into consideration the able and successful efforts of the prisoner after stranding for the rescue of his crew and salvage of his vessel, ordered him to be severely reprimanded, and cautioned to be careful in future.
