DEVASTATING PRAIRIE FIRES.

The Daily Mail's New York correspondent tele-
graphs:—Chicago has been seized with a horrible
fear that the city will be destroyed by prairie
fires, which have broken out on account of the
unprecedented drought. The ground around the
city has been ploughed for miles with the object
of checking the flames. Cleveland, in the State
of Ohio, and other western towns are also
threatened with complete destruction. Live
stock have been burned to death in the fields,
houses have been razed to the ground, and timber
has been ruined. Many hundreds of people have
been rendered homeless. The danger has been
increased by the hardness of the soil, which
makes ploughing most difficult. Last night the
situation was extremely grave for Chicago and for
portions of five Western States.
