VETERINARY:

Order was read from the Veterinary Department, in reference to the exposure of sheep, or suspected, sheep, in markets or fairs, that the spread of the disease was, not to a considerable extent due to the presence of the affected sheep at these places, and that the Local Authority, if they had readily done so, should give definite instructions to their inspector to visit the principal fairs and markets in the Union for the purpose of preventing the sheep exposed therein.

Willis asked had any instructions been given to their inspector?

Clerk—No, I don't think any instructions given.

Willis—Don't you think they ought to be given?

Clerk—I think it would be necessary to prevent the spread of sheep-scab.

Willis—Why not make the order?

Clerk said the Inspector would then be engaged for additional compensation.
