To-day Dr Clery held an inquest at the Workhouse in connection with the death of Patrick Sheahan, 76 years, who on Tuesday week last inflicted severe wounds throat with a razir, from the effects of which he died yesterday. The deceased, who appeared to be of somewhat eccentric habits had been for some time past a patient in the general hospital. While sitting on his bed on the occasion mentioned he suddenly produced a raz r and drew it across his throat, almost severing his windpipe. Aid was immediately rendered by Drs Nolan, Humphreys, and Brennan. Evidence having been given by the officials and medical officers, the jury returned a verdict that the deceased died from the effects of wounds inflicted by himself white in a state of temporary insanity. The efficers were exonerated from any blame in connection with the occurrence.
