DEATH OF MR M. E. CONWAY-We regret to announce the death of Mr Moses E Conway, late Postmaster of Limerick, which took place rather suddenly at Madeira on Thursday last. It seems that Mr Conway had gone out there on a trip with his daughter for the benefit of his health, and he contracted a chill, which in a short time developed fatally. Mr Conway had had a very large Post Office experience in England before coming to this country, and for nearly 25 years he had charge of the Limerick postal district. He took a great interest in the service, and by all ranks, as well as by the general public, was most highly esteemed for his kindly and unassuming manner. He was one of the most constant patrons of the Limerick Athletic and Bicycle Club, which institution had always his warmest support, and in other respects took a considerable part in anything for the welfare of the city. On retiring, under the 65 age limit, some five or six years ago, Mr Conway removed permanently from Limerick to Dablin.
