**WALKING ACROSS THE ATLANTIC.**

Captain William Oldrieve, of Boston, Massachusetts, is believed to be walking across the Atlantic. He has invented a sort of seven-leagu boot, says the *Daily Chronicle*, something between a canoe and a snow shoe, which is made of cedar and has a length of some five feet. A pair of these will easily support a ten-stone man, and the captain weighs less. Some time ago we are assured, he did a twenty-seven hours' promenade in Massachusetts Bay, crossed the rapids of the St Lawrence, and braved the current three miles above Niagara. In the Gulf of Mexico a storm carried him far out to sea, and he was given up for lost, when the assembled spectators beheld him skipping landward over the billows with ease and elegance of a water fowl. For foot Captain Oldrieve will look to Captain Andrew who has already twice traversed the Atlantic in an open boat, and who is now making a third voyage. We hope Captain Oldrieve will keep his sea-legs, but we should not like to be in his shoes.
