WEEKLY AUCTION.—The usual great weekly sale of cattle and sheep at the Agricultural Hall was held to-day (Saturday) by Messrs Ebrill Bros, Auctioneers, and was the most successful since the season opened. The attractive programme, comprising over 60 superior in-calf heifers and dairy cows, brought together a large concourse of buyers from all sides. Bidding from start to finish was very brisk. The first lot on the list was a wellbrought out batch of 10 in-calf heifers from Mr W Harnett which sold from 217 10s down to 213 each, general average 14 guineas; Mr Foley's heifers sold at prices ranging from 215 down to 212 each; Mr O'Gorman for a lot of five obtained on an average 12 guineas each; Mr Enright's sold from 213 10s down to 212 each; Mr J C Cooper's sold on an average of 210. There were 20 dairy cows on the programme.
