#### STATISTICS OF FAILURES, BILLS OF SALE, AND BONDS AND JUDGMENTS.

The number of Failures recorded in Ireland  
during the week ending May 13th, was 10, viz:—  
New Bankruptcy Proceedings published in the  
*Dublin Gazette*, 4; Deeds of Arrangement filed at  
the Bills of Sale Office, 6. The respective numbers  
in the corresponding week of last year were, Bank-  
ruptcies, 5; Deeds of Arrangement, 6—Total 11;  
being a net increase in Bankruptcies of 8, and a  
net increase in Deeds of Arrangement in 1899, to  
date, of 8.

The number of Bills of Sale published in  
Ireland for the same week was 4. The number in  
the corresponding week of last year was 7, showing  
a decrease of 3, being a net decrease in 1899, to  
date, of 31.

The number of Bonds and Judgments published  
for the same week was 58, of which 20 were  
against Traders, and 38 against Farmers and non-  
Traders. The numbers in the corresponding week  
of last year were 19 against Traders, and 28  
against Farmers and non-Traders, showing an  
increase of 1 against Traders, and an increase of  
12 against Farmers and non-Traders, being a net  
decrease in 1899, to date, of 28.—*Kemp's Mercantile  
Gazette.*
